## >>> Fall 2024 Resource Fair

Workforce Education hosted our second Community Resource Fair in October. We had 25 community partners on campus to share their services with students, and over 300 students, staff and faculty visited the fair. One highlight was the DSHS mobile team were here and enrolled students in the SNAP food benefits program. The Multicultural Child and Family Hope Center spoke to 100 students to share their services which range from childcare to housing and homelessness support services! The Community Resource Fair will be held every Fall and Spring Quarters.

# >>> Library Workshop Coming Your Way Soon

In November, our Workforce Education Outreach Navigator, Lorrie Ann, offered a workshop on Exploring Career and Training Opportunities at the Swasey Branch of Tacoma Public Libraries. We demonstrated multiple career interest assessments, how to use them to explore job trends and then find related training opportunities. We wrapped up with covering the grants and scholarships available to help adult students pay for college. This workshop will be offered again during the winter at both the Swasey and Moore library branches, as well as an in-depth presentation about TCC career training programs, the enrollment and financial aid process, and resources available on campus to help adult students succeed. What is your role, and what services do you provide to support our students? As a Pathway Specialist, I focus on guiding students to their desired educational path and supporting them through to completion by providing program information, educational workshops, and career networking opportunities. I also connect students facing academic, financial, or personal challenges with campus resources to help them achieve their goals and succeed confidently.



What are some Business Pathways you are in charge of? As the Business Pathway Specialist, I support students pursuing degrees in Business, Accounting, and Paralegal. Examples of short term certificates include: Human Resource Specialist, Paralegal Preferred Pro, and Assistant Bookkeeping Clerk, offering flexible learning options designed to prepare them for the workforce or career advancement.

Can you explain the stackable certificates that can lead to an Associate or Bachelor's Program? TCC's stackable Professional and Technical Certificates offer flexible options to enhance skills, prepare for entry-level roles, or advance in your career. These certificates can be earned individually or applied toward an Associate of Applied

Science (AAS) degree, and even one of our Bachelors Program (BAS). Being able to tailor education in this way can help adult students reach their career goals. Explore programs like Accounting Office Associate, Management, and specialized certificates such as Global Transportation & Secure Logistics or Entrepreneurship that provide pathways to a new or advancing career.
